From the Pastor's Pen

November will be a month of gratitude from start to finish, beginning and ending with candles. It starts November 3 with **All Saints' Sunday**, when we give God thanks for those who have died in faith this past year and now rest with Him. Last year we added a chime to the Roses of Remembrance rite. This year we're adding candles. After All Saints' Sunday, we'll continue to offer candles at all our Sunday services as a way to supplement the yellow prayer cards. People with recurring prayer requests will be encouraged to light a prayer candle, reducing the volume of prayers spoken by the pastor at the altar.

Our annual stewardship sermon series begins November 10 when **Bishop Dan Selbo** will preach the opening sermon, "Give to the NALC." It is an honor to host the Bishop (and he's a very good preacher), so circle the date and be sure to come. I'll preach the middle sermon, "Give to StJLC," November 17. Pr. Weber will preach the concluding sermon, "Give Thanks," November 24 - which will be **Consecration Sunday**, when we come to the altar and lay our pledges down to the Lord. God has blessed both our denomination and our congregation with health and growth. I encourage you to start praying now about how you will respond with thanks.



Thanksgiving will be just a few days later, November 28. But because Thanksgiving so late this year, our Advent preparations will start early. Last year we handed out hundreds of **Advent wreaths for use at home**. The Youth will make more Advent wreaths November 20. You can pick up your Advent candles and wreath starting November 24. Then join us the following Tuesday, November 26, as we **decorate the church** for Advent and Christmas. It takes a lot of work to make it happen. Join us and help us get the church ready for the hundreds of guests who will worship with us this Holiday Season.

The month draws to a close with the first Sunday of **Advent**, December 1. Once again, our services will start with the lighting of the candles on the Advent wreath. This year, our sermon series will focus on the Advent prayers from the Lutheran Book of Worship as we prepare ourselves for season and ask, "Are you Kingdom ready?"

It's a busy month coming up, beginning and ending with candles and filled with gratitude throughout. Join us!

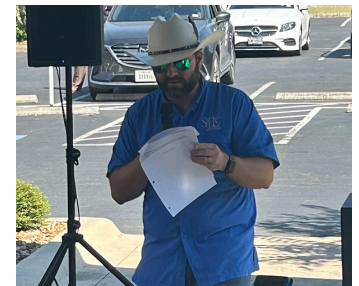
Youth Mission Trip

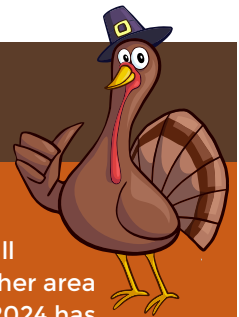
