From the Pastor's Pen

Our church's New Year's resolution is to help you grow in your faith. We start a new **sermon series** January 12 called

"Reasons for Hope." The name comes from Peter's First Letter, where he challenges Christians to "always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who asks you to give a reason for the hope that is in you" (1st Peter 3:15). Pastor Weber and I will spend the first two months of the New Year getting you prepared to give your reasons for hope. We've written a sermon series which answers some commonly-asked questions about our faith, like "How do

questions about our faith, like "How do you know there is a God? Did life come through creation or evolution? Can we trust the Bible, and is the Bible true? Did Jesus really rise from the dead? If God is good, why is there evil? How do Islam and Christianity compare?" Pastor Weber and I both love this kind of theology and are eager to preach on the questions. This will be a great series to invite your family and friends, because chances are they've asked some of the same questions themselves. Why not bring them to church to find the answer?

We'll have 15-20 minutes to address the questions on Sunday mornings. Those of you who want to dive into greater depth and detail are invited to come to the **Wednesday night classes** beginning January 15, 6:30 pm-7:30 pm in the Family Life Center. Pastor Weber and I will

team-teach the classes, sharing more of what we've learned on each subject and devoting plenty of time to your questions and conversation. Jesus commands

us to "love the Lord your God with all your mind" (Matthew 22:37). The "Reasons for Hope" sermon series and classes will help you love God with your mind by thinking more deeply about God's truth and growing in your faith.

We also want to help you grow in faith by joining the church.

The New Year is a great time for new starts. If you've been thinking about joining StJLC, now is the time to act. Our **New Member classes** will be held in the Family Life Center on Sunday afternoons after the Late Service, 12 noon to 1:30pm (in time to get you home for football!), beginning January 26. We'll provide lunch and lead you each week through a step in our discipleship pathway: Worship Weekly, Walk Daily, Connect Consistently, and Serve Monthly. We'll receive you into membership during worship services on Sunday, March 2.



The physical, emotional and spiritual effects following the loss of a loved one can be devastating. The good news is that grieving folks who find a support group often discover that the process from "mourning to joy" is possible.

GriefShare is a 14-week program where participants will find support and practical advice. Each of the 14 sessions stands alone so it is not necessary to begin with Session 1. Participants may start at any point during the cycle.

A new StJLC GriefShare cycle under the guidance of Pastor Robert Weber is scheduled to begin Tuesday, January 14, 2025, 10am to noon and the Wednesday evening cycle begins January 15, 2025, from 6pm to 8pm. The meeting location for both are rooms 118 and 119 in the Education Wing.
